Oh, boy. What a salesman. He sure understands expressions of necessity. <u>Have</u> to and <u>must</u>. Let's watch.

SLICK OLLIE In order to get the apartment, you 'must' sign the lease. If you do not sign the lease, then I 'have' to show the apartment to other people.

<u>Have to</u> and <u>must</u> mean almost the same thing. But <u>must</u> is a little stronger. When we <u>have to</u> do something, we usually have a choice. For example, do Karina and Victor <u>have to</u> sign the lease right now? If they don't, somebody else can take the apartment. If they do, they will sign a lease they do not understand. When we <u>must</u> do something, we usually don't have a choice. Karina and Victor <u>must</u> make a decision. They do not

have a choice about that. What do you think they should do?

Read, understand and practice

Both **Have to** and **Must** express necessity or obligation. But we use **Have to** more often than **Must**.

what happens when they make a different decision. And action.

**APT. #67** 

Slick Ollie holds out the pen as before. Victor takes it.

KARINA But Victor

**VICTOR** Karina, who is the man here? Who knows best?

**KARINA** You do. But Victor, we need to understand this completely before we sign it.

**VICTOR** But someone else will take the apartment!

**KARINA** Then they will take it. We have to take our time.

VICTOR I think we will bring it back tomorrow

Jason looks over the Lease as Karina and Victor look on.
